

## Gaviscon Infant - Breastfed

## Gaviscon (Trade Name) - Infant powder

Use: Gastric reflux suppressant

Gaviscon Infant works by mixing with the stomach contents, stabilising and thickening them to reduce the amount of reflux occurring. It is produced in a powder form and comes in one-dose sachets.

Administration: In breastfed babies, Gaviscon is mixed with 5 ml of cooled boiled water or breastmilk to form a smooth paste. This paste is usually adequate to administer from a spoon or syringe. A further 10 ml of fluid can be added to the paste, and fed in the same way or from a feeding bottle. Gaviscon Infant is best fed before or partway during a feed. Given at this time, it is generally more readily accepted than afterwards. It also helps to prevent reflux occurring during the feed.

(Please note this differs from the instructions on the box, but has been discussed with the manufacturer, Reckitt Benckiser.)

Side effects: Include constipation.

**Warning:** Gaviscon Infant is "Not for infants under 1 year except under medical supervision". Do not use Gaviscon Infant with feed thickeners.
